# Huge Numbers of Abortions are destroying the moral basis of our society

If there is one effect of the 1967 Abortion Act that has surely become apparent above all others, it must surely be this - the profound shift in our society's attitude to prenatal existence. A whole generation has now grown up "post-Abortion Act" which accepts that abortion is a necessary part of life. Indeed, for this generation, the question as to the rights or wrongs of abortion is genuinely puzzling. For our society as a whole it is no longer a moral issue at all; it is simply a way of dealing with "inconvenience".

Why do I say this? Well, we see the statistics: 214, 000 abortions per year in the UK (6.7 million since 1967), and less than 5% of them are carried out because of severe health risk to the mother or for severe foetal abnormalities incompatible. We "see" this, and we "shrug our shoulders" while returning to watch the TV. Publicly, some political figures, including Sir David Steele, who introduced the original bill to parliament, wring their hands and say: "We never intended there would be such numbers aborted."

For society as a whole the dilemma is that we have widely accepted what is now a "routine practice" of abortion while not recognising, or refusing to recognise, that this practice goes against the very fibre of our being. We are therefore "destroying ourselves"; for as we take away life in the overwhelming numbers we do, we steadily become anaesthetised to this, and are destroying the moral basis of our society in the process.
