A Short History

Our Society grew from a seed sown by Mgr. Philip Flannigan. He was parish priest at Sacred Heart Parish in Bellshill where he also looked after the spiritual welfare of staff and patients of the then largest maternity hospital in Lanarkshire, Bellshill Maternity. This was around the time of The Abortion Act (1967) of David Steel and the Mgr. and his assistant priests experienced first hand some of its worst effects.

As a result of his concerns and with the support of Bishop Thomson, the Bishop of Motherwell, the Society of the Innocents was formed in Lanarkshire in 1977.

Two Sisters of the Franciscans of the Immaculate Conception were deployed to work alongside volunteer counsellors.

Bishop Thomson initially made available the old Parish house in Laird St in Coatbridge. Two moves later we find ourselves in Viewpark Rd. in Motherwell.

Thirty years on the Society continues to be supported by His Lordship Bishop Devine, Bishop of Motherwell; Fr Hugh Kelly, Chaplain; our Franciscan Sisters, Sr. Rosaria & Sr. Maria Goretti, and volunteer counsellors.

What we do!

A range of services is available to any women or girl who thinks they may be pregnant and for whom the pregnancy is likely to cause a problem.

These services include:

- Free pregnancy testing
- Confidential counselling
- Practical help

IN ADDITION:

Counsellors also speak in schools on the development of the baby in the womb and the long term effects abortion can have both emotionally and physically for the mother.

We are supported by Pro Life Cells which have been formed in schools, parishes & local communities. These groups offer support both practically, by providing layettes, and spiritually by praying for the pro life cause.

Training to be a counsellor

Counsellors receive training from our in house training team and with input from outside agencies including doctors, lawyers and moral theologians.

Counsellors come from all walks of life and various age groups.

All aspiring counsellors require to undergo a period of training, evaluation and supervised practice.

Counsellors are recruited annually for both counseling and educational visits.


